

COVID-19 and Signpost Surveys

Covid-19 put a stop to all our volunteering activities. However, as we ease out of lockdown, we are now at a stage we are able to restart our volunteering activities.

The virus has not gone and government restrictions remain in place so it is important that we adhere to government guidance to keep you, our volunteers, safe.

Before you go

- **Do not** undertake a signpost survey if:
 - You or anyone you live with is showing signs of Coronavirus.
 - You have been advised to self-isolate by NHS Test & Protect.
 - Scottish Government Coronavirus guidance restricts what you can do.
- Pack a face covering and hand sanitiser.
- If you use public transport to get to your survey start point, adhere to social distancing and wear a face covering. Consider alternative forms of transport such as a bike or car.
- You are responsible for keeping yourself safe as well as looking out for the safety of others.

On site

- Stick to the 2-metre social distancing guidance.
- Try not to touch any gates and surfaces. If you do need to then use your hand sanitiser before and after touching them.
- When you touch the sign, for example to check its stability, use your hand sanitiser once you have finished.
- If you are surveying with another volunteer from outside your household, you should use your hand sanitiser when passing things between each other.
- Do not share food and drink with other volunteers.

When you get home

- Dispose of or wash your face covering.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Wash or disinfect any equipment as appropriate.
- Send us your survey report.
